

Toonumbar Dam valve installation works

RE: Notice of work at Toonumbar Dam and interruption to water supply on Iron Pot and Eden Creeks

WaterNSW, the state's bulk water supplier and system operator is undertaking upgrade work to replace a valve at Toonumbar Dam and the work will interrupt water supply to Iron Pot and Eden Creeks over 2 weeks starting the 5 August 2020.

Toonumbar Dam is a small dam situated on Iron Pot Creek about 30 kilometres west of Kyogle on the NSW North Coast. The dam helps irrigate the Richmond Valley and supplies water to farmers along Iron Pot and Eden creeks.

This work is planned to start from **5 Aug 2020 and take 2 weeks to complete**. There is a planned water interruption for 2 weeks starting from Wednesday 5 August 2020 and finishing on Wednesday 19 August 2020. Residents and customers living downstream on Iron Pot Creek and Eden Creek may not have supply during this period.

WaterNSW are committed to keeping the local community informed and will provide early warning network (EWN) updates ahead of the outage, and when it concludes. This work is essential to ensure the efficient delivery of water to customers and to meet contemporary safety and engineering standards.

The works are being undertaken on WaterNSW lands in areas where there is no public access and recreation areas at Toonumbar Dam are to remain open. The works are scheduled to take place during standard construction hours on Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 1pm.
