# **Camden and Sharpes Weirs**

### **Erosion repairs completed**

August 2025

The erosion repair work at Camden and Sharpes Weirs is now complete. The repairs will stabilise the riverbank and prevent further damage to the weir structures, improve environmental resilience, support the longterm health of the river system and protect adjoining properties.

WaterNSW has repaired the erosion at Camden and Sharpes Weirs following damage from multiple flooding events.

The repairs included removing the vegetation and unstable soil, reshaping and stabilising the embankment and placing large rocks to stabilise the riverbank.

All areas impacted by the work have been restored. Together with local Aboriginal traditional owners, we are planting more than 500 native plant species along the banks of Camden and Sharpes Weirs, including the endangered Camden White Gum at Camden Weir.

Access to the work site at Sharpes Weir in Ellis Lane required a temporary closure of a Council footpath from Mooresfield Lane to the Nepean River for public safety during the work. The footpath has been reopened to the public.
