Levels are forecast to vary at Hay weir

28 December 2018

We are advising customers and community that river levels at Hay weir are forecast to fall to about 6m by next week. Increased dam releases are currently in transit upstream of Carrathool and the Hay Weir level is expected to gradually increase to about 7.5m by mid-January 2019.

Berembed and Gogeldrie weirs are currently below their full supply levels, while Maude and Redbank Weirs are being held at relatively steady heights to deliver water to environmental assets in the Lowbidgee. Tombullen Weir is currently being drained to maintain the levels at Hay Weir above 6m.

Due to prolonged dry and warm weather conditions and very little inflows from tributaries the focus of river operations is to conserve water and to minimise operational losses. Hence, the tighter river operations increase the likelihood of lower river and weir levels.

We further advise customers and landholders to monitor river levels closely and to make necessary arrangements to ensure infrastructure and livestock are not impacted by the low river levels.
