When you are visiting some of our dams, you might be lucky enough to see a koala along the way!

Some areas of bushland provide habitat for koalas.

Koalas have round, fluffy ears and a spoon-shaped nose.

They eat eucalyptus leaves and can sleep for up to 22 hours a day!

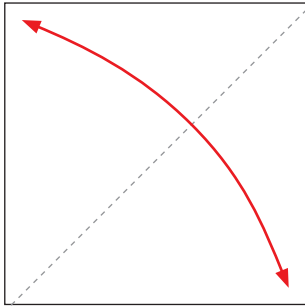
Koalas are most closely related to wombats.

Female koalas have a backwards-facing pouch for their young to stay until they are fully developed.

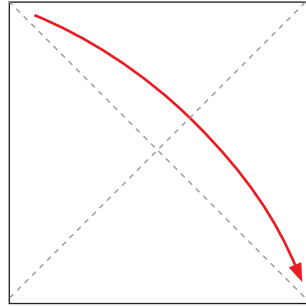
Did you know that a baby koala is called a joey?



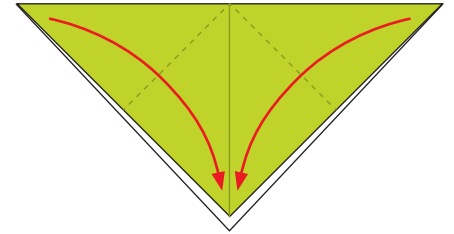
origami koala



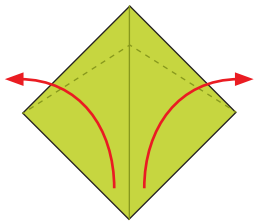
1 Fold in half at the dashed line to crease and reopen flat.



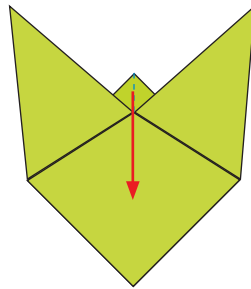
2 Fold in half to form a triangle.



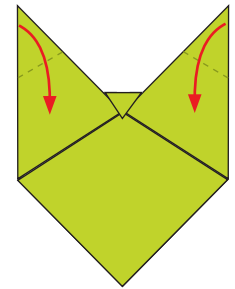
3 Fold down corners along the dashed lines.



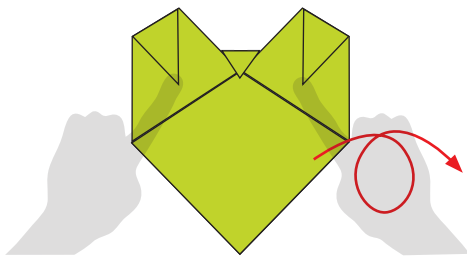
4 Fold the 2 flaps up and out along the dashed lines.



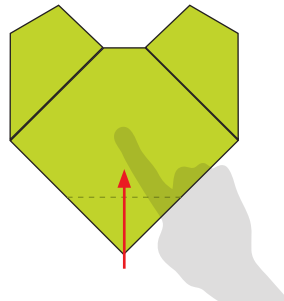
5 Fold down.



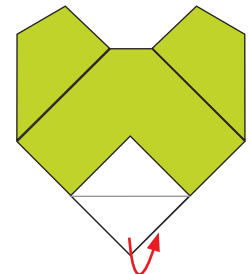
6 Fold down the 2 ears along the dashed line.



7 Turn over.



8 Fold up top layer along the dashed line.



9 Fold the lower layer behind. Add detail to your koala.
