NSW Public Water Register - Identifying ESID and work ID

How-to guide

This guide outlines the steps required to accurately identify the work in the NSW Public Water Register for metering purposes.

NSW Public Water Register is a tool to search for information about water licences and approvals issued under the Water Act 1912 or Water Management Act 2000.

Definitions

Name	Definition
ESID	Unique extraction site ID (ESID) in WaterNSW's online Water Accounting System (iWAS).
Work ID	The data acquisition service (DAS) workspace ID or unique identifier generated for each metered site. It is a combination of the work approval number, ESID and meter number.
DQP Portal	WaterNSW system to manage the meter compliance process.
Data Acquisition System (DAS)	WaterNSW's data acquisition system (DAS) to receive and store daily transmission of meter reading data, alarm activations etc.
DQP Concierge Service	WaterNSW support service offered to DQPs to assist them with the meter compliance process. Please contact our Customer Service Centre on 1300 662 077 or book an appointment on our website at waternsw.com.au/metering

Process


1. Search NSW Public Water Register

- a) Access the NSW Public Water Register to search for information about water licences and approvals issued.
- b) Select from one of the available options to search for the required information. For example, 'A particular licence or approval (including conditions)' and click on the next button.

c) Select from one of the available options to search for the required information about a water license or approval. For example, Approval issued under the Water Management Act 2000 and click on the search button.

Select the type of licence or approval and enter the licence or approval number: Water access licence (WAL): a WAL number starts with the letters 'WAL' followed by several numbers; a WAL also has a reference number that starts with a two digit number, followed by 'AL' and then several numbers.
1912 water licence: a water licence number starts with a two digit number, followed by a two letter code and then several numbers. Note: a PT reference number cannot be entered.
Approval: an approval number starts with a two digit number, followed by a two letter code (WA, UA, CA or FW) and then several numbers. Search for information about either a: O Water access licence (WAL) issued under the Water Management Act 2000 O Water Act 1912 Licences and Authorities O Approval issued under the Water Management Act 2000 Find out if a Water Act 1912 licence has been converted O Water licence conversion status

d) Use the following drop-down options to search for the issued approval. For example, in the case of 80WA702828,

- select 80 from the 1st drop box,
- o select WA from the 2nd drop box,

- o enter the last six numbers 702828 in the 3rd available free text box, and
- o click on the search button, once you have entered the correct approval number.

 - Water access licences nominating these works (reference number, water access licence (WAL) etc.)

MR6927-00001	A. Under section 101A of the Water Management Act 2000, metering equipment must be installed, used and properly maintained in connection with all water supply works, except those works to which an exemption applies as described in clauses 230, 231, 232 or 233 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018.
	B. Metering equipment standards are set out in the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018. An approval holder must comply with the standards set out in the Regulation.

Reporting

MR7736-00001

A. Under clause 238 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018, the approval holder must give a copy of a certificate provided under clause 237(1) and (2) to the Minister within 28 days of receiving the certificate.

B. This condition does not apply to works to which an exemption from the mandatory metering equipment condition applies as described in clauses 230, 231, 232 or 233 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018.

MW6983-00004

A. Once the approval holder becomes aware of a breach of any condition on this approval, the approval holder must notify the Minister as soon as practicable.

B. If the initial notification was not in writing, written notice must be provided within seven days of becoming aware of the breach by emailing:

Other Conditions

Water management works

DK1215-00001

The holder of the approval must not construct or install works used for conveying, distributing or storing water taken by means of the approved work that obstruct the reasonable passage of floodwaters into or from a river.

Monitoring and recording

MR7737-00001

A. The approval holder must comply with the recording and reporting requirements set out in clause 244 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018 from 1 December 2021.

B. This condition does not apply to works to which an exemption from the mandatory metering equipment condition applies as described in clause 231, 232 or 233 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018.

MR7739-00001

A. The approval holder must comply with the recording and reporting requirements set out in clause 250 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018 from 1 December 2021.

B. This condition does not apply:

i. to works which are subject to the mandatory metering equipment condition under section 101A of the Water Management Act

ii. if metering equipment that complies with the metering equipment standards in the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018 is installed and used in relation to the work, and the approval holder complies with the requirements of clause 244, and the requirements of clause 244A or the telemetry specifications set out in the approved data logging and telemetry specifications, so that data regarding water taken is transmitted in accordance with those specifications.

MR7738-00001

A. The approval holder must comply with the reporting requirements set out in clause 244A of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018 from 1 December 2021.

B. This condition does not apply:

i. if telemetry is installed and used in relation to the work used to take water, and that complies with the data logging and telemetry specifications, or

ii. to works to which an exemption from the mandatory metering equipment condition applies as described in clause 231, 232 or 233 of the Water Management (General) Regulation 2018.
